1	<b>OVERTURE 2021-41</b> from Tennessee Valley Presbytery (to 49th OC)
2	"Amend BCO 35-1 to Expand Potential Witness Eligibility"
3	
4	[Editorial Note: This overture was originally submitted to the 48th General
5	Assembly (2021), which "committed" it "to the 49th GA OC in Birmingham,
6	and in the interim" referred it "to the Ad Interim Committee on Abusefor
7	them to give advice to the 49th GA OC."]
8	
9	Whereas, the prosecutor and the accused should have the right to seek to call anyone as a
10	witness. Either party may object to any proposed witness and the court would rule on
11	the objection. Even if an objection is overruled, the court would still need to judge the
12	credibility of the witness and his testimony; and
13	
14	Whereas, to exclude those who do not believe in the existence of God or in a future state of
15	rewards and punishments may, in certain cases, hamper the prosecutor or the accused
16	in presenting necessary evidence, or hamper the interest of justice;
17	
18	<b>Therefore,</b> be it resolved to strike the first sentence of <i>BCO</i> 35-1 to read as follows:
19	
20	All persons of proper age and intelligence are competent witnesses,
21	except such as do not believe in the existence of God, or in a future state
22	of rewards and punishments. The accused party may be allowed, but
23	shall not be compelled to testify; but the accuser shall be required to
24	testify, on the demand of the accused. Either party has the right to
25	challenge a witness who he believes to be incompetent, and the court
26	shall decide upon his competency. It belongs to the court to judge the
27	credibility to be attached to all evidence.
