1	<b>OVERTURE 22</b> from the South Florida Presbytery (to CCB, OC)
2	"Amend BCO 13-2 to clarify Teaching Elder Presbytery Membership"
3	
4	Whereas, BCO 8-7 and 13-2 both speak to the location where a Teaching Elder's presbytery
5 6	membership should be held; and
7	Whereas, BCO 8-7 and 13-2 can be read as inconsistent with each other. BCO 8-7 requires
8	a TE's membership to be held in the presbytery "within whose bounds he <i>labors</i> " but
9	BCO 13-2 says that his membership is to be held within the "geographical bounds he
10	resides"; and
11 12	Whereas, it is possible to reside in the geographical bounds of one presbytery, but labor in
13	the geographical bounds of a neighboring presbytery; and
14	the geographical bounds of a heighboring presbytery, and
15	Whereas, the following sentence of BCO 13-2 confirms the intention that a TE be a member
16	of the presbytery where he labors when it says, "When a minister <i>labors</i> outside the
17	geographical bounds"; and
18	
19	Whereas, it is proper and expedient for a presbytery to have jurisdiction over the TEs who
20	labor within its geographical bounds (see Morton Smith, Commentary on the Book of
21	Church Order, 142).
22	
23	<b>Therefore, be it resolved</b> that the South Florida Presbytery hereby overtures the 51st General
24	Assembly to amend BCO 13-2 as follows ( <u>underlining</u> for additions, strikethrough for
25	deletions):
26	
27	13-2. A minister shall be required to hold his membership in the Presbytery within whose
28	geographical bounds he resides <u>labors</u> , unless there are reasons which are satisfactory to
29	his Presbytery why he should not do so. When a minister labors outside the geographical
30 31	bounds of, or in a work not under the jurisdiction of his Presbytery, at home or abroad, it shall be only with the full concurrence of and under circumstances agreeable to his
32	Presbytery, and to the Presbytery within whose geographical bounds he labors, if one
33	exists. When a minister shall continue on the rolls of his Presbytery without a call to a
34	particular work for a prolonged period, not exceeding three years, the procedure as set
35	forth in BCO 34-10 shall be followed. A minister without call shall make or file a report
36	to his Presbytery at least once each year.
37	
38	So that the amended section will read as follows:
39	
40	13-2. A minister shall be required to hold his membership in the Presbytery within whose
41	geographical bounds he labors, unless there are reasons which are satisfactory to his
42	Presbytery why he should not do so. When a minister labors outside the geographical

bounds of, or in a work not under the jurisdiction of his Presbytery, at home or abroad, it

shall be only with the full concurrence of and under circumstances agreeable to his Presbytery, and to the Presbytery within whose geographical bounds he labors, if one

exists. When a minister shall continue on the rolls of his Presbytery without a call to a particular work for a prolonged period, not exceeding three years, the procedure as set forth in BCO 34-10 shall be followed.
