19 20 21 22	Whereas, the 1980 General Assembly tasked the Permanent Committee on Judicial Business to re-write the Directory of Worship, but this committee failed to achieve the original goal of authoring an authoritative Directory of Public Worship beyond chapters 56-58 concerning the sacraments; and
232425	Whereas , the most recent changes to our Directory of Public Worship being the constitutionalizing of <i>BCO</i> 59-3 by the 47 th General Assembly; and
26 27 28	Whereas, the current Directory of Public Worship is wrongly considered just pious advice; and
29 30 31 32	Whereas , the current Directory of Public Worship is often neglected or ignored due to its lack of constitutionality;
33 34 35 36	Therefore, be it resolved, that the Calvary Presbytery hereby requests the 52 nd General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in America to declare <i>BCO</i> chapters 60 through 63 having fully constitutional status.
