(to CCB, OC) 1 **OVERTURE 25** from the Northwest Georgia Presbytery "Amend BCO 46-4 to Add a Class of Associate Membership for Honorably Retired 2 TEs" 3 4 Whereas our current BCO 46-4 defines an associate member as those believers temporarily 5 residing in a location other than their permanent homes; 6 7 Whereas the aim of this overture is pastoral and not for the purpose of changing our polity; 8 or the needs of TEs called to works which are not to a local church. (Those differing 9 calls as far as a defined relationship to a local church require a more complex study); 10 11 Whereas ministers of the gospel who have served the church well and received Honorably 12 Retired (HR) status may need ongoing pastoral care and vital relationships that local 13 churches can give but is not practical for Presbytery Shepherding committees or 14 Pastoral Care Committee to implement. The pastoral care of an HR minister would be 15 a good application of I Timothy 5:10 coupled with the charge of John 13:14 and more 16 suitable for deacons and elders of a local church to tend to their needs, Paul's 17 Partnership with the Philippian church was vital to his wellbeing and sanctification. 18 (Phil.1:1-4); 19 20 Whereas we already have a provision to assign ministers under discipline to a local church 21 (BCO 46-8). We hold to two types of discipline, one being the regular preaching of 22 the Word, and the other which is discipline for the unrepentant/repenting brother or 23 sister. The assigning of an HR TE as an Associate member of a local church for what 24 we describe as good discipline and retaining membership in a Presbytery would give 25 to an HR what the WCF speaks of "so as to conduce to their mutual good, both in the 26 inward and outward man... and saints are bound to maintain a holy fellowship and 27 communion in the worship of God." (WCF 26.1-2); 28 29 30 Whereas for an HR minister they may need to locate close to children and grandchildren for ongoing support and not be able to travel to Presbytery several times during the year. 31 32 The gifted men on a church Session and diaconate may treat him and his wife pastorally (I Corinthians 12, Proverbs 24:17) without the awkwardness of an undefined 33 34 relationship; 35 Whereas the HR minister should not have to give up his ministerial privileges and financial 36 tax status by becoming demitted from the ministry to get care; 37 38 Whereas we have examples from Scripture of care given to aged leaders that resulted in 39 40 mutual benefit from a close relationship: Moses & Joshua, David & his young men, Elijah & Elisha, Paul & Timothy, or the prophecy from Jesus (John 21:17b-19). In all 41 these cases there was a close, local, and defined relationship; 42 43 Therefore, be it resolved that BCO 46-4 is amended as follows (underlining for additions; 44 strikethrough for deletions): 45

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2	46-4 . Associate members are <u>of two kinds:</u>
3	1. EThose believers temporarily residing in a location other than their
4	permanent homes. Such believers may become associate members of a
5	particular church without ceasing to be communicant members of their
6	home churches.
7	2. <u>A Teaching Elder in this Church that is Honorably Retired may continue</u>
8	to hold their membership with and are accountable to their Presbytery, and
9	associate membership may be approved by both the Presbytery and the
10	Session.
11	Every HR TE shall be a member of a Presbytery and have communicant
12	fellowship in any PCA or NAPARC church. His Presbytery may request a
13	Session to exercise pastoral care over him in its behalf. HR TEs may only
14	vote at Presbytery or GA
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16	An associate member shall have all the rights and privileges of that church,
17	with the exception of voting in a congregational or corporation meeting, and
18	holding an office in that church.
