 21-1. No minister, licentiate or candidate shall receive a call from a church <u>or a call to a needful work (*BCO* 21-12)</u> but by the permission of his Presbytery. In any case, the minister must not physically leave the field until the Presbytery or its commission empowered to handle uncontested requests for dissolution has dissolved the relation.

The associate or assistant pastors may continue to serve a congregation when the pastoral relation of the senior pastor is dissolved, but they may not normally succeed the senior pastor without an intervening term of service in a different field of labor. However a congregation by a secret ballot with four-fifths (4/5) majority vote may petition Presbytery for an exception which by a three-fourths (3/4) majority vote Presbytery may grant. Presbytery needs to determine if the dissolution of the pastoral relationship with the senior pastor was brought about in Christian love and good order on the part of the parties concerned.

In the case of a needful work (BCO 21-12), when any minister shall tender the resignation of his call to his Presbytery, the Presbytery shall cite the calling entity to appear, to show cause why the Presbytery should or should not accept the resignation. If the calling entity fails to appear, or if its reasons for retaining the minister be deemed insufficient, his resignation shall be accepted and the relation dissolved. If any calling entity desires to be relieved of the minister called to the particular needful work, a similar procedure shall be observed. In any case, the minister must not physically leave the field until the Presbytery or its commission empowered to handle uncontested requests for dissolution has dissolved the relation.

RATIONALE:

 The current provisions of the BCO allow for calls to come from entities other than congregations but do not specify how those calls should be presented and prosecuted or dissolved. Additionally, the ordination and installation questions presume a man is being ordained and installed into a pastoral role in a congregation. That means that the questions are inapplicable in the context of a campus minister or a chaplain, for example.

Current *BCO* 8-4 is the result of an editing process from material in the *BCO* of the PCUS, which included additional material describing "works as may be needful to the Church" as follows:

"When a Minister is appointed to be a teacher in a school of divinity, or to give instruction in the doctrines and duties of religion to youth assembled in a college or university, it appertains to his office to take a pastoral oversight of those committed to his charge, and to be diligent' in sowing the seed of the Word and gathering the fruit thereof, as one who watches for souls."

There are several common categories of calls to a Teaching Elder that are not to a congregation. Among them would be campus minister (RUF), military and other chaplains

(MNA), missionary (MTW), and teachers (CTS and CC). Other permanent committees and agencies (e.g., Ridge Haven, Geneva Benefits) may or could issue calls to a teaching elder. The Stated Clerk (*RAO* 3-1) is called by the General Assembly. All of these calls are legitimate to the ministry (teaching elder) and require a minister to hold his membership in a Presbytery (*BCO* 13-2). The Overture seeks to regularize how those calls are presented and dissolved and to avoid the confusion that has sometimes resulted from a lack of clarity.

The Overture sacrifices brevity for the sake of clarity in the ordination and installation of men in the case of a needful work. It adds a new subsection to BCO 21 to set forth questions applicable in a non-congregational context to avoid numerous footnotes or an entire new chapter to the BCO that would necessitate renumbering of all subsequent chapters.

Finally, the Overture seeks to give the permanent committees and agencies the same flexibility with respect to calls that congregations currently enjoy while underscoring the responsibility of Presbyteries to approve or dissolve calls, just as they do with congregational pastoral calls.
