1 **OVERTURE 37** from the Southeast Alabama Presbytery (to CCB, OC) "Amend BCO 12-3 so that a Session May Elect One of Its Members as Moderator in 2 Judicial Cases" 3 4 Be it resolved that BCO 12-3 is amended as follows (underlining for additions; strikethrough 5 for deletions): 6 7 12-3. When a church is without a pastor, the moderator of the Session may be 8 either a minister appointed for that purpose by the Presbytery, with consent of 9 the Session, or one invited by the Session to preside on a particular occasion, 10 or one of its own members elected to preside. In judicial cases, the Session may 11 elect one of its members to preside as moderator shall be a or invite a minister 12 of the Presbytery to which the church belongs to preside as moderator. 13 14 So that *BCO* 12-3 as amended would read: 15 16 12-3. When a church is without a pastor, the moderator of the Session may be 17 either a minister appointed for that purpose by the Presbytery, with consent of 18 the Session, or one invited by the Session to preside on a particular occasion, 19 or one of its own members elected to preside. In judicial cases, the Session may 20 elect one of its members to preside as moderator or invite a minister of the 21 Presbytery to which the church belongs to preside as moderator. 22 23 **RATIONALE:** 24 25 26 Sessions should have discretion to elect a moderator in judicial cases. Some Sessions may have ruling elders who are highly experienced in church discipline and cases of process, and 27 they should have the liberty to elect such a ruling elder to preside. In instances where this is 28 not the case, the revised provision retains the right of the Session to invite a minister of the 29 Presbytery to preside. 30 31 32 Adopted by the Southeast Alabama Presbytery at its stated meeting, April 22, 2025 33
