


Welcome from Ohio Valley Presbytery

Welcome from the Ohio Valley Presbytery Host Committee

To all of the Commissioners and their families,

Welcome back to Louisville! It has been 13 years since we hosted General Assembly here in Louisville. So much has happened since June 1999. Millennial madness, 9/11, hurricanes and tsunamis, wars and rumors of wars.

Back then, greetings came from the Great Lakes Presbytery: this time, Ohio Valley Presbytery welcomes you. We give God the glory for the growth that allowed Great Lakes Presbytery (GLP) to multiply once to form Ohio Valley (OVP), and then GLP and OVP to each multiply once to form Central Indiana Presbytery and Ohio Presbytery. So where there was one, there are now four presbyteries.

We hope to highlight the "Fortieth" by using the theme "Generations in Community". We've been around for one generation, but our denomination includes several generations. We hope you will join others in the PCA in reading

and praying along with Mike Ross in the Fifty Days of Prayer leading up to the Assembly. He will help us reflect on this blessing, opportunity and challenge. The PCA's birthday comes later in the year, but we like to think that the celebration begins with this Assembly.

In the worship services, we will highlight the three phrases in our founding motto; Faithful to the Scriptures, True to the Reformed Faith, and Obedient to the Great Commission. We hope to weave into the Assembly and the adjoining events and activities more celebrations of what God has done in and through OVP in this first generation of our existence.

Not too far from Louisville was born B. B. Warfield. His writings are as relevant today as they were in his day. He preached a sermon, "The Saving Christ" in which he said:

"It is in this great fact, indeed, that there lies the whole essence of the gospel. For let us never forget that the gospel is not good advice, but good news. It does not come to us to make known to us what we must do to earn salvation for ourselves, but proclaiming to us what Jesus has done to save us. It is salvation, a completed salvation that it announces to us; and the burden of its message is just the words of our text — that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners."

And on whether Christians can move beyond the gospel, in *Perfectionism*, he answered resoundingly, "No."

"There is nothing in us or done by us, at any stage of our earthly development, because of which we are acceptable to God. We must always be accepted for Christ's sake, or we cannot ever be accepted at all. This is not true of us only when we believe. It is just as true after we have believed. It will continue to be trust as long as we live. Our need of Christ does not cease with our believing; nor does the nature of our relation to Him or to God through Him ever alter, no matter what our attainments in Christian graces or our achievements in behavior may be. It is always on His "blood and righteousness" alone that we can rest."

We look forward to your visit to our presbytery and to Louisville. Pray with us that God will be glorified and His people edified. Don't hesitate to contact us if we can make your journey and experience here more blessed. And may we remain faithful to the gospel.



TRAVEL INFORMATION

Arriving by Plane

Louisville is served by the Louisville International Airport, about 15 minutes drive from downtown Louisville. All the General Assembly business meetings, seminars and worship services will be held downtown at the Kentucky International Conference Center. Women and Family events will be held at the Galt House.

Transportation from Airport

Parking

All of the General Assembly hotels provide parking for a fee. The Kentucky International Conference Center offers two parking garages. The Cowger Garage is located at Fourth and Market Streets. The Commonwealth Garage is located on Jefferson Street between Third and Fourth Streets (next to the Hyatt Regency Hotel). Rates are \$2 per hour up to 3 hours; \$8 for 3 hours to 8 hours; \$10 for 8 hours to 24 hours. (A lost parking ticket will result in a \$10 charge.)
