

**To the Presbyteries of the Presbyterian Church in America
and the Member Denominations of NAPARC**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The 53rd General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in America, acting upon the overture of the Presbytery of the Mississippi Valley, has resolved that it would be helpful to the cause of Christ to set aside a solemn day of fasting and prayer for the revival and renewal of the Church.

Presbyteries are urged to appoint a suitable day during the month of September 2026 (or as soon thereafter as practical) on which congregations, RUF campus ministries, officers, and members will humble themselves before the Lord, fast, and pray. We are called to heartfelt repentance over the sins of ministers, officers, members, and congregations, and to earnest petition for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, the blessing of God upon the preached Word, the conversion of the lost, the planting of faithful churches, and the advance of the gospel in our communities, on college campuses, and throughout the world.

Presbyteries are further encouraged to conclude the day with a solemn convocation of praise and the preaching of the Word.

The General Assembly also extends a warm invitation to the sister churches of NAPARC to join us during September in seeking the mercy and favor of God for the revival and renewal of Christ's church in North America. Where prudence and opportunity allow, local Presbyteries may likewise invite other like-minded evangelical congregations in their regions to participate.

To assist Presbytery Clerks in preparation for this observance, I have appointed TE Rhett P. Dodson (The Ohio Presbytery) and RE Olin R. McNeely (Calvary Presbytery) to prepare a brief treatise on fasting and prayer, together with practical considerations to aid our people in observing the fast.

May the Lord grant us grace to seek and serve Him promptly with sincere hearts, and may He be pleased to revive His work in the midst of the years.
